

Here are some tips for effective waste and recycling management:

- Only household garbage is to be deposited in the garbage dumpsters or in the garbage chute (where available)
- Oversized garbage items that do not fit in a dumpster can be left in the area of the garbage bins where signage is indicated
- Do not deposit recyclables in the garbage dumpster/chute, or vice versa, as this will contaminate the garbage or recyclables and the authorities will halt garbage pick up services
- Please utilize all recycling bins as overflowing bins will not be emptied
- Flatten cardboard boxes prior to putting them in the recycling bins
- Large cardboard can be either broken down to fit in the recycling bins or flattened and placed behind or between the recycling bins
- Do not tie your recyclables up in a plastic bag otherwise they are treated as waste and will contaminate the recycling bins. You may however recycle plastic bags by putting all bags in one tied plastic bag
- Household hazardous waste (paint, propane tanks, aerosol cans, chemicals, needles, cooking oil, etc.) is not to be disposed of in the garbage or recycling bins and needs to be taken to a proper disposal centre
- Large appliances cannot be left for disposal, they need to be taken to proper location for disposal – info available through your regional waste management department/local municipality or region
- Electronic waste items are not to be placed in the garbage dumpster or chute, it must be taken to a proper disposal centre
- Batteries can be dropped in the marked bin located in the laundry room for safe disposal (this may not be available at all locations)
- Items that you wish to dispose of that are still in good condition and which can be reused can be donated at approved drop off locations such as The Salvation Army, etc.
